On August 10th, ACA member Kim Smith led a discussion of how our group can best deal with the media. Kim works with media relations and had a lot of good information for us. Her advice to ACA is to put together a media packet that can be sent to editors and reporters. By building long-term relationships, and being open and honest with reporters, our organization could certainly benefit. Kim stressed that the media lives by deadlines but that timely local stories of interest to the public would likely be run. As we all know, just the mention of the word *atheism* is often enough to get a reaction from people. This could be used to our advantage when we promote projects that promote positive atheism.

Kim also discussed the various types of media and how we might utilize them. For example, newspaper reporters and magazine reporters are not after the same type of story. Dr. Steven Weinberg will be September's guest speaker. The board decided not to overly publicize the event as the small room at Furr's might easily be overwhelmed. Dr. Weinberg has not yet responded to Susan's question about appearing on TV the morning of his lecture.

October's guest speaker will be Catherine Fahringer, San Antonio atheist activist and board member of the Freedom From Religion Foundation. Catherine will appear on The Atheist Experience that morning.

Host a Foreign Atheist Student

The following messages came to me over the internet. What a great way to do something positive for another atheist! And what a great way to show the world that not all Americans are ignorant fundamentalists! Here's what I got:

The American Field Service (AFS) wants to hear from humanist households willing to host foreign exchange students. Many of these students find it difficult to get a home when they put "Atheist" "Humanist" or "None" under the application form's question about "Religious Affiliation". Since there is much higher nonbelief in Europe than the US--in many European countries unbelievers are in the majority in the younger generations--this may leave many students in need of a good American home.

One member of the ASHS leaders list--Carol Smith from Milwaukee--has already been in touch with AFS about hosting a French school girl who could not find a host family because of her atheism.

I hope you will publicize the message below in your local group newsletter and at your group meetings. Taking part in this program will surely be a rewarding experience for the hosts, as well as an opportunity to give a foreign student an introduction to America that they will remember all their life.

Greetings! I am writing on behalf of AFS Intercultural Programmes, a non-profit foreign exchange program for High school youth. The American Field Service started in WW1, when a group of volunteer ambulance drivers helped the wounded. They reconvened for WW2, but then decided they would begin a youth exchange to promote global peace and understanding that would work to prevent war. Now for over 50 years, AFS has exchanged youth from over 50 countries, uniting students, volunteers, and host families around the world.

AFS is currently looking for host families interested in opening their lives and homes to foreign exchange students for a semester or a year. Hosting a student with AFS is an enriching, voluntary experience that can span a few weeks, months, a semester, or a year. We do have several students coming this August from all over the world who do not yet have families to call their own.

Besides hosting a student, there are many other ways to get involved with AFS. High school students or recent graduates can also take advantage of AFS programs abroad and spend a semester, year, or summer in another country, learning a language and becoming a part of a new culture.

AFS also needs volunteers who would like to be involved

with hosted students and host families. Each hosted student needs a liaison, which entails including your hosted student in a few of your family's activities once a month.


Survey Results


Q. What direction would you like to see ACA take? Rate the importance of each from 1-5 with 5 being most important.

In these graphs, the bars on the left represent the responses of ACA members. In all, 29 people responded in time to have their opinions counted. of those, 20 where members.


Political activism (marches/ protests)




Social activities (movie nights/happy hours)
