## A Day with the ACA Planned around the Bat Cruise

Our upcoming ACA Bat Cruise event is not just about having a leisurely boat ride and watching bats. We've added other events throughout the day to encourage atheists who would like to hang out with us to come to Austin, have some fun, and chat with other like-minded people. We especially encourage out-of-towners to come down for this great set of events. The date is Saturday, September 25, 2010. Full details are available on our Web site.

**Matt Dillahunty's lecture will be from 3-5pm.** From 3-5pm, our own Matt Dillahunty will give a lecture on "The Superiority of Secular Morality." The event will be at Howson Hall in the First Unitarian Universalist Church of Austin, 4700 Grover Ave. The event is free. See the Web site for special instructions for those who would like to leave their cars at the church for the remainder of the day. **The Bat Cruise will be from, 6-8pm.** The boat leaves promptly at 6pm, so don't be late! Consider parking at the One Texas Center Garage, 505 Barton Springs Road and walking to the launch. The garage is behind Threadgills (see below) and free. The garage is also accessible from Riverside. Cruise tickets are \$25 and \$10 and may be purchased from the ACA's products page ([atheist-community.org/products](http://atheist-community.org/products)).

If you would like to snack or eat dinner on the boat, that's fine. No glass containers are allowed, however.

**Dinner at Threadgill's is from 8:15-9:15pm.** For those that didn't eat on the boat, Threadgill's is a convenient dinner spot that has done a great job accommodating our after-the-TV-show dinners. The restaurant is a short walk from the launch point, so there's no need to move your car. The location is 301 W. Riverside. We will get a headcount for dinner on the cruise so everyone will get a quick seat. If you're going to the next event, you'll need to watch your time.

**Comedy Show starts at 10pm.** The final event of the evening will be a comedy show at Esther's Follies, 525 E. 6th St., (512) 320-0553 at 10pm. Tickets are \$22 and are likely to sell out. Get yours at least two weeks before the event. If you haven't seen the show, you're in for a treat. It's a great mix of comedy, singing, magic, and satire--a perfect way to end the day. ■

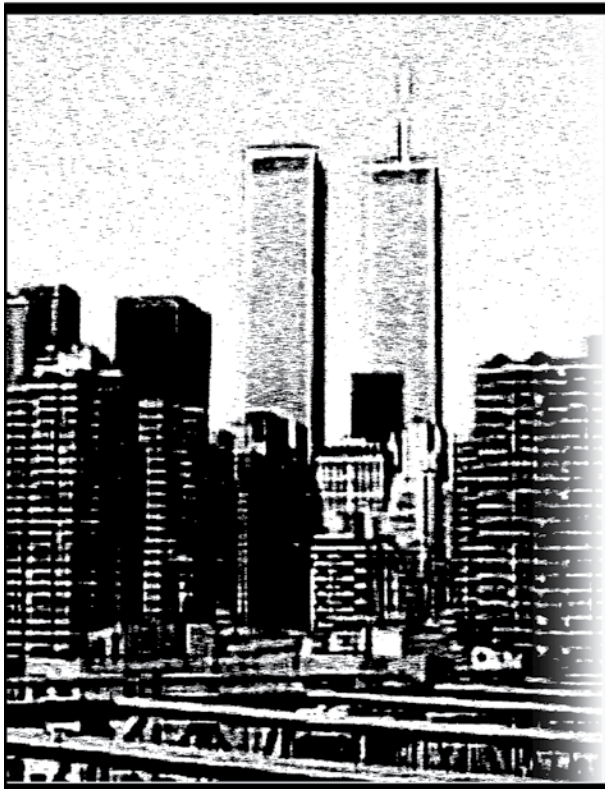
